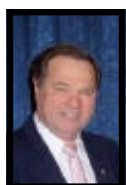

Educational Officer's Message



It is my pleasure to return as Squadron Educational Officer (SEO) for the 2010-2011 year. Thanks to Cdr Fred Stiehl, P, the transition of responsibilities from him to me is taking place very smoothly. The spring basic public boating course (ABC3) was a great success with 34 students. We owe many thanks to P/C Wally Stevenson, AP, and Cdr Fred Stiehl, P, for doing a great job as instructors for this course.

As your new SEO, I am looking forward to providing you the opportunity to participate in seminars, advanced educational courses (such as Seamanship, Piloting, and Advanced Piloting), and elective courses (such as Marine Electronics, Weather, and Instructor Development). I hope you take the opportunity to expand your marine educational horizon.

I would like to bring to your attention three upcoming seminars (Knots, Bends and Hitches; Boat Handling under Power; and Skipper Saver [Partners in Command]). The "Knots Bends and Hitches" seminar is a hands-on "learn how to tie knots" program geared to a wide range of audiences. Participants will learn to tie a set of the most useful knots, and then get to take the whole package home with them to practice these and a whole host of other knots described in the textbook. The seminar will be held on 11 May in the Ocean Pines Community Center East Room. The class size is limited to ten participants and the cost is \$20.00. Registration is at 1830, and the seminar starts at 1900. Please call me at 410-208-9747 to register in advance.

The "Boat Handling under Power" seminar shows boaters how to depart and dock under a variety of conditions. In addition, participants will learn about trimming the boat underway. The seminar materials include a waterproof United States Power Squadrons Captain's Quick Guide and Student Notes. The seminar will be held on 25 May in the Ocean Pines Community Center Marlin Room. The cost is \$20.00. Registration is at 1830, and the seminar starts at 1900. Please call P/C Tony Smith, AP (410-600-0397) or me if you are interested.

The Skipper Saver (Partner in Command) seminar provides essential information to crew and passengers about what to do in the event the skipper becomes incapacitated while on the water. It also covers such topics as communications, safety equipment, the VHF marine

radio, distress calls, Digital Selective Calling, rules of the road, medical emergencies such as heat stroke and hypothermia, taking on water, life jackets, first aid kit, signaling equipment, and taking the helm. The seminar will be offered on 21 May at 1900 (registration at 1830) at the Ocean Pines Community Center East Room. Please contact P/C Judy Prange, P (410-641-5261) or me. The cost of this seminar is \$30.00.

Other seminars are in the planning stages for the summer. We will bring them to your attention through e-mail and newspaper announcements.

In June we will offer the advanced course, "Seamanship." The subject matter of this course builds upon the basics of recreational boating presented in basic public boating course. However, the course is open to those who have not taken the basic public boating course. Emphasis within the course has been placed on a higher level of boating skills, rules of the road and, as always, heightened awareness of safe boating. Topics covered in the course include responsibilities of the skipper, boat hull types and their behavior and stability, boat handling in various weather conditions, navigational rules, anchoring and mooring, emergencies on the water, and marlinspike seamanship (lines, knots, bends, etc.). The course will meet on nine consecutive Thursday evenings starting on 10 June in the Ocean Pines Community Center East Room. The classes will meet from 1900 to 2100 (registration is at 1830 on the evening of the first class). Books can be purchased in advance or at the first class at the cost of \$40.00. Please register by calling P/C Jim Bergold, AP, at 410-208-3975 or (after 6 June) me (410-208-9747).

The Education Department is looking for new blood to help out with the instruction of different courses. If you do not have training in teaching, we can provide it for you through our Instructor Development course.

Remember, all USPS courses and seminars are available to members and the public. Pass the word to your family and friends. All are welcome. The Education Department wishes you a happy and safe boating season.

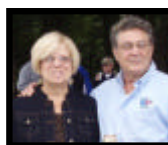

Safety Report



National Safe Boating Week (22-28 May) is just about upon us. Here are some statistics regarding boating accidents and WHY it is so important to BOAT SAFELY!

In the most recent year with complete data, 701 lives were lost as a result of recreational boating accidents in the U.S. and its territories. BWI (Boating While Intoxicated) was identified as part of the problem in 31% of those fatalities. Operators with a blood alcohol level of 0.10 percent (for most of us, that means just one to three beers) are 10 times as likely to be killed in a boating accident as a sober boater.

What about the remaining three deaths out of every four? Additional contributing factors were - excessive speed and other improper operation, poor vision, faulty equipment, and inadequate safety systems and devices

Every boater needs to be serious about boating safety. Remember, a boating mishap or fatality often involves innocent people who share in none of the blame, but all of the consequence. As a responsible boater, the life you save may very well be someone else's. Remember,
